ORGANICS

No Plastics of any kind.



FOOD WASTE

- Vegetables, Fruits & Peelings
- Meat, Fish & Bones
- Bread, Rice, Pasta
- Solid Dairy Products
- Egg & Nut Shells
- Coffee Grounds & Filters
- Tea Bags



SOILED PAPER PRODUCTS

- Paper Towels & Tissues
- Paper Food Containers
- Paper Plates & Cups
- Waxed Cardboard
- Waxed Paper
- Pizza Boxes



YARD WASTE

- Leaves & Twigs
- Sawdust & Woodchips
- Wood Shavings

PAPER

Paper must be kept as clean & dry as possible and separate from Container Recyclables.



- Newsprint
- Envelopes
- File Folders
- Advertising flyers (bond & glossy)
- Magazines
- Packing Paper
- Boxboard
- Textbooks
- Paperbacks
- Phone books
- Office Paper
- Shredded Paper (in a clear plastic bag)
- Greeting Cards
- Wrapping Paper



CARDBOARD

- Flatten all cardboard boxes.
- Do not include waxed coated cardboard.

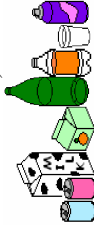


CONTAINERS

Containers can be mixed, but must be kept separate from Paper Recycling.



- Pop Cans (Aluminum)
- Pop & Water Bottles
- Plastic Containers (with #'s 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7)
- Plastic Bags
- Glass Bottles
- Glass Jars
- Milk & Juice Cartons
- Juice Boxes
- Styrofoam
- Packing (packing pellets are garbage)
- Styrofoam Cups & Plates
- Coffee Cup Lids
- Steel Cans & Lids
- Empty Aerosol Cans
- Small Scrap Metal Items
- Cardboard Cans (with metal ends)



GARBAGE

Not much goes in the garbage after you recycle and compost!

- Potato Chip Bags
- Candy Wrappers
- Plastic Food Wrap
- Carbon Paper
- Latex Gloves
- Incandescent Light Bulbs
- Styrofoam Packing Pellets
- Padded Envelopes
- Bubble Wrap
- Foam Packing Material
- Broken Glass (from windows, mirrors, ceramics, ornaments, etc.)
- Diapers
- Feminine Hygiene Products
- Fabric & Clothing

No Fluorescent Light Bulbs or any other Hazardous Waste
